



WA firms secure \$3.7m in grants

THREE Western Australian companies have received a combined \$3.7 million in federal government funds to advance technologies to combat climate change.

Funds distributed are part of the second round of the government's Climate Ready program, with a total of \$16.7 million allocated to companies around the country in the current round.

Cool Energy was awarded \$1.6 million to develop a new process for removing and capturing carbon dioxide from the production of natural gas.

ANSAC received \$1.9 million for research and development of small to medium scale commercial organic gasification and biomass combustion kilns.

ASX-listed Carnegie Corporation was awarded \$156,567 to develop an advanced tubeless heat recovery system for flue gases that would be used to pre-heat incoming combustion air.

Four WA businesses received a total of \$7 million in the first round of grants.
